Prof. Lando obtained her PhD in Social Communication from *La Pontificia Università Gregoriana, Roma, Italia*, in 2008. She holds an MA in Human and Intercultural Communication and BA in Audiovisual Productions, from Daystar University. Prof. Lando is the recipient of the 2013 George Gerbner Excellence Award. Prof. Lando is also the Chair of Daystar University Ethics Review Board (DU- ERB) as well as the Chair of Daystar University Chancellor's Forum. Further, she is University Council Member for Uzima University and Tangaza University College.

In addition to being an external Examiner for Nelson Mandela University, South Africa (since Jan 2020), Makerere University (since 18th Feb 2014) and St. Augustine University of Tanzania (SAUT) (since January 2009), Prof. Lando has assessed senior lecturers for Associate Professor promotion consideration for the University of Ghana and Pan Africa Christian University. She is an adjunct faculty to select universities in Eastern Africa, and has supervised several MA theses and PhD dissertations.

In 2016, Prof. Lando became the first African to be elected Board Member-at-Large of the International Communication Association (ICA) - <https://www.icahdq.org>, a more than 70 year-old global body that brings together communication scholars, practitioners and researchers. She thus steered a team that successfully hosted the first ICA regional conference in Africa, Nairobi, in 2016, and the first ICA Africa continental research and publication training workshop in Entebbe, Uganda in 2017. Prof. Lando is a member of various national, regional and international communication academic bodies, and has presented peer-reviewed papers both locally and internationally.
