

Lando has published: ten (10) scientific articles in Refereed Journals; written three (3) books; contributed eleven (11) Book Chapters in edited books; four (4) Articles in a Periodical (Magazine) and has four (4) Publications in the Press. Among her recent publications are: 'Digital Communications at Cross-roads in Africa: A Proposed Decolonial Solution Approach from Within' (2020), Kenya Citizens' Sovereignty and the EAC Nexus: The Role of Communication' (2020); The Impact of an Educational Media Intervention to Support Children's Early Learning in Rwanda (2019), A multi-national validity analysis of the self-perceived communication competence scale (2019) and Africana Symbolic Contextualism Theory (2018).

In addition to sitting on the Daystar University Senate Curriculum Review and Development Committee, Prof. Lando was part of the team that developed Daystar University PhD Communication Curriculum (2009/2010); and also developed the Social-Pastoral Communication Program for Uganda Martyrs University (2016/2017). Because of her vast exposure, Prof. Lando has helped Daystar University in the facilitation of partnerships and collaborations with The University of British Columbia (Canada) and Howard University (Washington DC, USA). Lando has convened nine (9) international Conferences in Daystar University and overseen (coordinating from Nairobi) two international conferences and one training workshop outside Kenya (at Uganda Martyrs University in 2017, the University of Ghana in 2018 and the University of Cape Town in Nov. 2020). She is the convener of the 2020 joint Daystar University and Howard University (Washington DC) Social Media Technology Conference.

In an attempt to provide a lasting solution to the perennial school fees plight of a number of MA Communication students of Daystar University, Prof. Lando founded the Master Communicators Welfare Association (MCWA) in 2013; that aims at raising funds to partially sponsor financially challenged but academically able MA Communication students of Daystar University {cf: <http://www.mcwa-kenya.com/>}. From 1999, Prof. Lando is an advisor to the Catholic Church (for a number of bishops and Dioceses in Kenya and beyond) on communication & media related matters. She also advises various religious institutes on matters of communication and media. Her research interests are in Communication and Media Ethics, Communication and Media Theory, Crisis Communication, Audio-Visual Communication, Media Practice and Management, New Media, as well as interdisciplinary research on topical social issues.
