International Conference on Children in Armed Conflict

This fortnight Tangaza University College hosted The International Conference on Children in Armed Conflict.



Organized by Universities Network for Children in Armed Conflict (UNETCHAC), the meeting focused on the impact of armed conflicts on children. The conference aims to provide an opportunity to expand the understanding of the impact of armed conflict on children.



The organizers hope to accomplish this when they implement the National Action Plan on UNSCR1325 that will involve a study by the International Universities Network. The research will be carried out in collaboration with the Institute of Political Studies "S. Pio V" and supported by the Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation.



Speaking at the gathering, the Vice Chancellor Designate, Rev. Prof. Patrick Mwania said the project aims to carry out research on the grave violations against children by armed conflict situations according to geographical areas.





The research findings will be easily disseminated in order to reach a wider audience. The conference, also involved a photo exhibition on children in armed conflict and post-conflict.

Armed conflict causes children widespread systematic violations of their human rights. They are also deprived of their fundamental rights to education, shelter, and the right to build a fruitful and holistic life.
